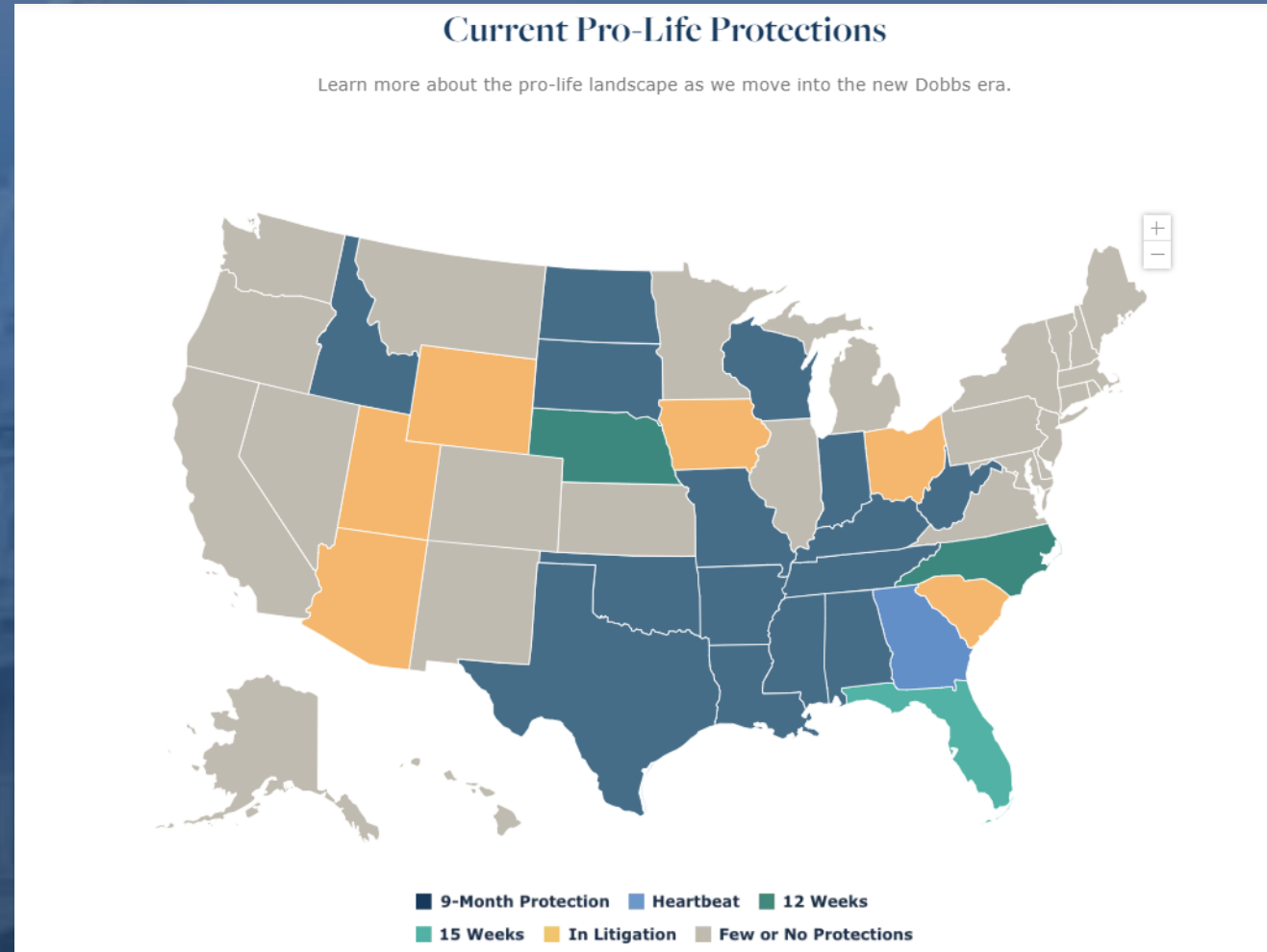

Abortion Centers Reopen

- An abortion center in eastern Oregon is opening near the borders of Idaho and Utah.
- Another abortion center in Bristol, Tennessee moved across the Tennessee line to Virginia.
- A former Memphis abortion center moved to the very southern edge of Illinois so they can continue to commit abortions on women from Arkansas, Mississippi and Tennessee.

“Planned Parenthood employees call the mobile center an act of activism in response to the Supreme Court's decision in June to overturn Roe v. Wade.

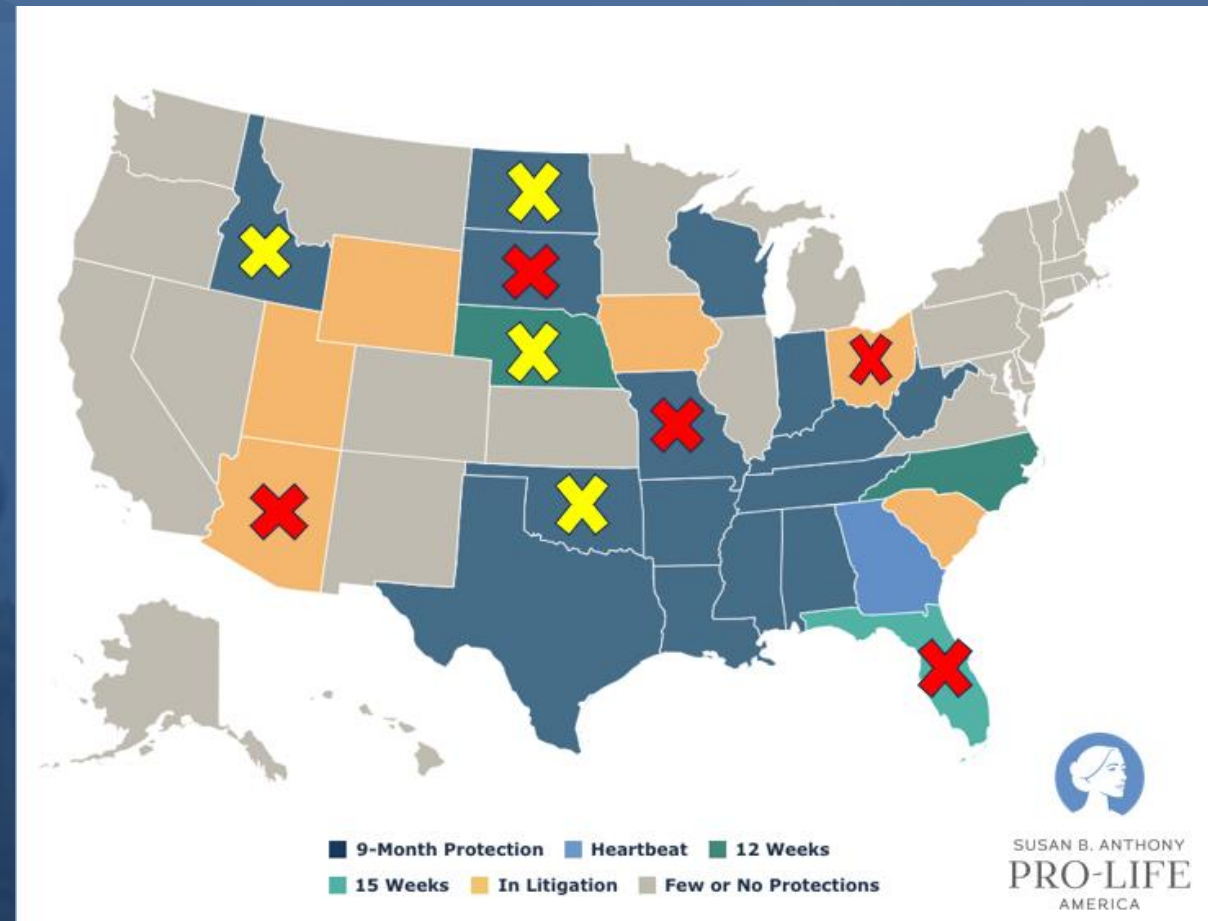

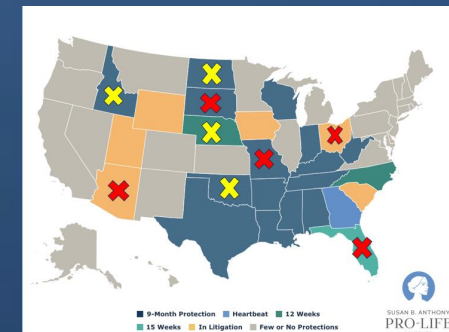
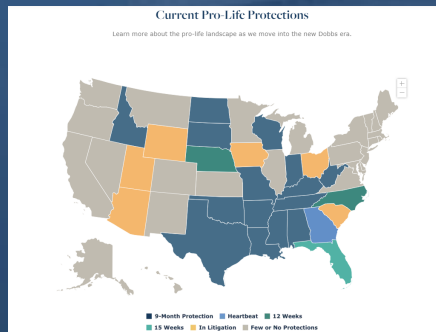

How do we save the rest?

National discussion

- The unborn deserve a voice on the national stage.
- Overturning Roe required a sustained national debate that spanned five decades.
- The Dobbs phase requires sustained ongoing effective efforts to shape cultural respect for the value of the unborn child in the womb alongside robust support for moms, dads and families.



How do we save the rest?

National protection

- We cannot remain a nation divided into life states and abortion states.
- States like California, New York and Illinois enshrine rights to abortion up until birth. Without national protections, the United States continues to be in the company of human rights abusers like North Korea and China that allow abortion until birth.
- Let's press for protections that have broad national support and move the culture toward even greater national protections.

How do we save the rest

Common Questions

What if my state has a more protective law?

- *Any federal protection will establish a federal minimum while allowing states to have stronger protections.*

Are national protections constitutional?

- *The 14th amendment demands equal protection under the law, and Congress is expressly responsible to enforce the 14th amendment.*

If we support federal protections for unborn children, won't that invite pro-abortion lawmakers to enact pro-abortion laws?

- *Radical pro-abortion laws are already a priority for the abortion lobby and their allies in Congress.*
